AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE ALL FORMS NECESSARY TO APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING FOR SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

The following Ordinance enacted by the Council of the City of Mt. Healthy of Hamilton County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Local Public Agency (LPA), in the matter of the stated described project.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has set aside monies for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Projects through the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, LPAs can apply for these monies and be selected for funding by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Restriping of crosswalks with addition of ADA-compliant curb ramps at the traffic intersections of Adams Road & Hamilton Avenue, McMakin Avenue & Hamilton Avenue, Compton Road & Hamilton Avenue, and Kinney Avenue & Hamilton Avenue, and the Completion of sidewalks on the north side of Compton Road between Forest & Werner is a transportation activity eligible to receive federal funding; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MT. HEALTHY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. The City Clerk of said LPA is hereby empowered on behalf of the LPA to prepare and execute an application for SRTS funds for the stated described project and to submit same to the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

Section 2. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$156,649.75, of which the LPA, if awarded the funds, agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the construction Page $1\ {\rm of}\ 2$

cost over and above the maximum amount provided by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

Section 3. Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) if necessary, maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) if necessary, hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

Section 4. If the application is approved for the funding the City Manager of said LPA is hereby empowered on behalf of the LPA to enter into a contract with the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation necessary to complete the above described project.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure to take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage to meet the Safe Routes to School application requirements.
