# PUBLIC INPUT

# Nancy Kersell (7413 Elizabeth)

Discuss speeding on Elizabeth, asked council to strongly consider speed humps. Concerned for safety the kids, as well as herself and residents. City manager shared that the studies had 20-30 data points, will be discussed at meeting after council.

# MAYOR'S REPORT: James Wolf

- ➤ Hamilton County Report came out. Comprehensive survey, WeThrive got grant to come in and do survey of residents regarding social determinants of public health; findings came in today, just forwarded to city council. WeThrive will use this data to drive future projects.
- ➤ 35,000 WeThrive grant moved into second phase. Jacqueline Johnson-Wilkinson and Jodie Pickering are running the program in collaboration with Tree Commission, Tikkun Farm and School District are meeting with Hamilton County Public Health to address action steps and dates when they need to have everything accomplished.

# **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT: Scott Bauer**

- Negotiations with Fire Department continue. In mediation phase. Second meeting with mediator on December 8, 2023.
- > Part-Time Police Union contract should be at next meeting. Some minor changes (language adjustment).
- CDBG January or February for three year block grant.

- On 12/14 the library will hold an Open House in their future location (old CVS building) from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Will have boards with renderings.
- Forest-Madison project will be bid in mid-January.
- > JMA recommending Alita for Harrison project. Hoping to schedule preconstruction meeting this month.
- Christmas in Mt. Healthy on December 16. City-sponsored skating rink behind Little Dutch Bakery. Square Mile and Little Dutch will have booths set up.
- ➤ Email from Aaron Horsley on Wetlands update: 24 volunteers to remove honeysuckle, planning another post-event clean-up.
- New one year note bond rate 6.25%.
- Veterans Pavers update: 20 sold since June, plaza starting to fill up.

# PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPORT: Justin Westrich

- Last reported to council in September.
- Street sweeping twice a year vs cleaning out every storm drain in city.
- Nine trees taken down that were dead at request of Urban Tree Commission; stumps grounded. Ended up removing total of 23 stumps.
- Picking up litter, mowing.
- > Trucks and loader inspected for winter, repaired and ready to go.
- Still have to put up the star and streamers. Not a lot of Christmas decorations to go in town. Open to ideas.
- > Salt Contract with Springfield Township, \$80/ton, will get salt needed. Increase of \$10/ton over last year.
- Hamilton Avenue work signs still up because it is still an active work zone. If ground pavement is 40 degrees and getting colder, state can't do any paving. Between State of Ohio and paving contractor.
